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George D. Kuh is Adjunct Research Professor of Education Policy at the University of Illinois and Chancellor’s Professor of Higher Education Emeritus at Indiana University Bloomington. He currently directs the National Institute of Learning Outcomes Assessment co-located at Indiana University and the University of Illinois. Founding director of the widely-used National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE), George has written extensively about student engagement, assessment, institutional improvement, and college and university cultures, and consulted with more than 350 colleges and universities in the U.S. and abroad. His recent publications include *Student Success in College: Creating Conditions That Matter* (2005, 2010), *Piecing Together the Student Success Puzzle: Research, Propositions, and Recommendations* (2007), *High-Impact Practices* (2008), and *Ensuring Quality & Taking High-Impact Practices to Scale* (2013). Recipient of nine honorary degrees, in 2001, he received Indiana University’s prestigious Tracy Sonneborn Award for a distinguished career of teaching and research. George earned the B.A. at Luther College, M.S. at the St. Cloud State University, and Ph.D. at the University of Iowa.

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
